

USCGA Tournament At PB Dye

GENERAL RULES

- Summer rule, USGA and PB Dye rules apply to Group A. A couple of pace-focused rule adjustments are made for Group B, C, D, seniors and Ladies.
- Pace-focused rule adjustments (for groups B, C, D & Ladies):
 - Lost ball should be played by dropping a ball at the estimated area with one stroke penalty. Out of bound ball should be played by dropping a ball at the estimated area with two stroke penalty.
 - Double par is the maximum score for each hole.
 - All putts within the leather grip of a putter will be treated as a give-me (gimmy). **Player must measure and receive approval from all fellow players.**
- Groups A players play from the Gold tee. Group B plays from the blue, Groups C & D and seniors players play from the White tee and Ladies play from the Red tee.
- Group B, C & D, OB ball plays as Hazard, lost ball takes 1 stroke penalty
- The USCGA handicap is used for the Net score calculation for the Groups A, B, C. Also, Group D uses the Callaway system for their Net score computation. Ladies group will awarded 1 Gross winner and 1 Callaway net score winner.
- All players must maintain a pace of 15 minutes per hole. The course marshal has the discretion to force any late groups to skip a hole if deemed necessary.
- If the players are forced to skip a hole by the Marshal, the average score of the other similar holes (par 3, 4, or 5) plus a one-stroke penalty will be used for that hole.
- USCGA assigned handicap supersedes USGA handicap. USCGA determines the handicap of each player by consideration of USGA handicap, references from other members, and prior USCGA tournament records (please see www.uscgatour.org for details).
- All lateral hazards are marked with red line. Drop a ball within two club-lengths from the point where the ball crossed the red line and receive one stroke penalty.
- According to local rule, a ball in tall fescue will be played as a lateral hazard.
- If you have questions with how your opponent calculates the strokes, please challenge it on the spot or before you turn in the score card.
- Range finder and sky caddy are allowed for the tournament. The owner can choose to share the distance information if he/she chooses.
- **Longest Drive: #17 Closest to the Pin: #2 & #11** (Men and Ladies will hit from their own tee box)

Each golf cart (two players) should keep scores for all four players. (Scoring must be accurate. Players with incorrect scores will be disqualified). Each foursome should submit two signed score sheets at the end of the round.
